



A globe shows Earth. Globes are shaped like Earth. They are round like a ball. They let you see the whole world.



Maps are drawings of Earth. They take our round Earth and put it on flat paper. Maps can be folded. They are easier to carry than globes.






This park has many **mountains** and is covered with forests. Mountains are the highest kind of land. Forests are large areas with many trees and plants.




There are some green parts on this map. Green shows that there are many forests. You can use color to help you read a map.





This is a photograph of a beach. The water is the **ocean**. An ocean is very large. It is made of salt water.

In this photograph it is easy to see where the land ends and the ocean begins.



Remember that globes use color to show what things are. Blue is the color used to show oceans, **rivers**, and lakes. By looking at the globe, you can see where the blue water is.
